*How do you think Vashti feels at first? What helps you feel better when you feel you "can't" do something?*

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## Let's Explore Push and Pull

Here are some activities the whole family can do together!

### "Press Here" Art Collage

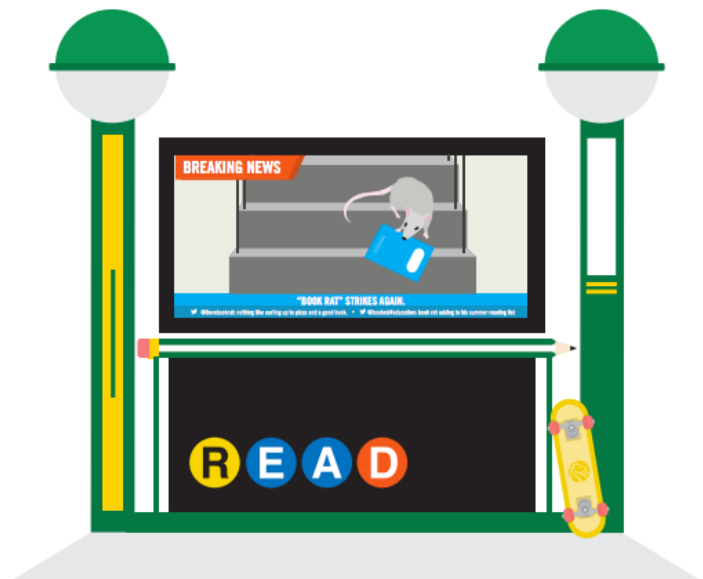
Materials: a variety of sponges, cotton balls, stickers, and anything else that involves pressing, Paint or food coloring

Help your child dip and press materials into paint or food coloring and dab onto large paper to create their own shapes and designs!

Talk to your child about what they are making, what shapes and colors you see in their work, etc. Encourage them to use as many materials as they'd like!

### Push and Pull "Seesaw"

Two people link both hands and sit on the floor. Take turns as one of you (gently!) pushes and the other gently pulls. Talk about it: Which direction do you move in? Is it the same direction? What about if you both "push" or "pull" at the same time? Why?



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
