# At Home Storytime for Families

## **Let's Explore Shapes**

Here are some activities the whole family can do together!

### **Not a Box Drawing**

Draw a box on a piece of paper and let your child draw or color their own ideas of what a box can be.

Talk about it: "Tell me about what you are coloring. What made you decide to draw that?"

#### **Box Art**

Challenge your imagination to turn recycled boxes into new creations!

Use different-sized boxes to make a rocket ship or airplane, a" giant" building, an animal, or anything else you can imagine.

### I Spy Shapes

Play 'I Spy' with different shapes. "I Spy a circle. Can you find all the circles in the room?"

### **Collaging with Shapes!**

Cut out different shapes from construction paper and have your child create pictures from the shapes!
